As I announced at Mass last week, during the season of Lent we will be celebrating Mass "*ad orientem*". I know some of you aren't familiar with what that means so I wanted to share a word of explanation.

All of our postures at Mass are meant to help us understand our faith. That's why we stand or sit or kneel at certain parts. The same can be said about the way the priest orients himself during Mass. The Mass "*versus-populum*" (toward the people) seeks to image Christ (the priest) standing before His bride (the Church/people) as they are joined together in the Eucharist.

Mass "*ad orientem*" emphasizes the Church as the Body of Christ. The priest AND the people act as Christ offering Himself in sacrifice to His Father. It has nothing to do with the priest "*turning his back on the people*" and everything to do with the unity of the priest AND his parishioners in worship together.

During Lent, I thought it might be enriching to emphasize this aspect of our liturgy. Mass "*versus-populum*" remains the normal way of celebrating Mass in our Archdiocese, and after Lent we will return to that posture. I hope this small explanation will help you to worship God in a deeper way this Lenten season and, as always, I look forward to celebrating Mass with you here at Holy Name of Jesus.
